Travel

Drive?

The drive is long, but very beautiful as you drive through Glen Coe, beside the Caledonian Canal and down through Glen Sheil. Depending on where you are travelling from you may decide to give yourself time to drive and enjoy the journey through Scotland.

Train?

There is a train station at Kyle of Lochalsh, however times often don't match up too well.

Many find that a sleeper train to Fort William or Glasgow followed by a hire car (or pick up) works well.

Daily flights to Inverness from many UK airports allow the option of flying. Again you can hire a car or arrange a pick up.

Accommodation

There is plenty of accommodation all over the island of Skye, it is worth noting that many of the roads on Skye are small and slow. If you are wanting to explore the Cuillin then being based between Sligachan and Glen Brittle is best.

The **famous Sligachan** has a few options, hotel, bunkhouse or camping. The bar is superb with excellent locally brewed ales, and food locally produced too.
